It certainly was great to be back to see our students for the final term of the Year. This term, expect school reports to come home on Monday 13th December.

We are looking forward to a robust term of learning!

Values for Term 4: The values for the term are Succeed, Responsibility and Whanaungatanga, with students thinking about what that means for their behaviour and learning.

CURRICULUM - We are focussing on:

Reading: Making connections, Vocabulary, Questioning, Summarising and Predictions.

Writing: Descriptions, Recounts, and Information Reports.

Maths: Number and Place value, Geometry (Shapes and Transformations), Multiplication and Division.

Learning Modules: We are continuing weeks 1 - 6 with Module 6, 'Life As We Know it' then week 7 onwards we start Module 7, 'Celebration Central' where the students will develop their knowledge of different reasons to celebrate around the world.



Reminders

- Year 3 students will begin their swimming lessons at the Papatoetoe Centennial Pools each Wednesday from the 20th of October. Swimming notices will be sent home first week in term 4.
- Lunches: We ask that the children bring some fruit or vegetables in their lunchbox to enjoy at break time and a bottle of water to drink throughout the day.
- Waste Free Lunches: PCS is a waste free lunch school.
 Students are encouraged to bring healthy lunches and to try their best to have no rubbish!
- Home Learning: A Home
 Learning sheet will be sent out
 which covers the whole term.
 Home Learning is due back at
 school to be checked on Fridays.
- <u>Spelling words</u>: 10 new words each week.
- Mathletics: Children in the Kakariki Team have access to Mathletics and can log in at home to complete tasks. We recommend 10 minutes a day on this website.
- Reading: Children will have a school reader 2 3 times a week and may also bring home a library book to share. Look after these books in their book bags missing or damaged books will need replacing. The children should be reading at home for at least 10 minutes daily. You can support your child by setting aside some time each day as Home Learning time.

Holidays: Keep that learning going
